




The Alcázar of Seville

From 1970 to 1991, Rafael Manzano Martos served as the Director-Curator and Governor of the Alcázar of Seville, a royal palace.

Originally a Moorish fort, the Alcázar is one of the best remaining examples of Mudéjar architecture.








La Casa de Contratación

La Casa de Contratación (House of Trade), located in Seville, Spain, was a government agency under the Spanish Empire from the 16th to the 18th centuries which dealt with legal disputes on trade with the Americas. It includes a chapel where Christopher Columbus met with Ferdinand and Isabella. The House recently reopened after structural renovation, remodeling, and restoration. Rafael Manzano Martos served as architect and archaeologist.





Colegio Notaria

Colegio Notarial (Notary College), located in Seville, Spain, is a former convent restored and readapted by Rafael Manzano Martos.



Casa Fernando Chueca

Casa Fernando Chueca (Home of Fernando Chueca), located in the Santa Cruz District of Seville, Spain, is new construction built from 1973 to 1975. Rafael Manzano Martos served as architect.

Catedral de Huelva

Catedral de Huelva (Cathedral of Huelva), located in Huelva, Spain, underwent an addition and restoration from 1975 to 1980. Rafael Manzano, architect.








La Manzana
