${\bf ROSWELL\, AND\, ANOTHER\, MYSTERIOUS\, DEATH.}$

My name is Dennis Bossack, and along with my wife Ann, own and operate the UFO LAB in Richmond, Rhode Island, USA. We are a museum, a research center and gift shop. Later, Ann opened a second UFO Lab in Albuquerque, New Mexico.

Ann's father, Richard Clayton Harris Jr., had been the Budget and Fiscal Officer at the Roswell Air Force Base in 1947, and one of his duties was to allocate the funds required for cleaning up the Roswell crash and maintaining the cover-up about it. He would never discuss the Roswell incident.

However, in 1997, Strange Universe contacted Ann about her shop, which at that time it was the only one of its kind. They were engaged in doing a piece of filming about the shop, when they found about her father's previous connection with Roswell. They therefore asked Kevin Randle to interview Mr Harris, and the latter agreed to the scheme.

In the filmed interview with my father-in-law, he had admitted that the crashed craft at Roswell had been a space-ship. And on August 12, 1997, he was murdered in very strange circumstances.

I myself was previously employed by an "above top-secret" agency within a Government. I retired from employment with the agency two years ago, and I am now engaged in writing a book about the agency.
