#### **EDITORIAL**

#### **CLOSING IN NOW?**

British listeners who heard and saw the evening news on BBC2 Television at 6 p.m. on Monday, November 23rd, 1998, will have learned that, for some time past, there has been a vandalistic epidemic of cat-killing in the area around London. The bodies of these animals are being found without heads and without tails, and totally bloodless.

We learn that a London doctor telephoned next day (November 24th) to the BBC (Broadcasting House); the BBC Television Centre; *The Times* (newspaper); *The News of the World* (newspaper); and *The Daily Mirror* (newspaper), all of whom totally denied any knowledge whatsoever of such a story.

On the same day I telephoned to the Cat Protection League in London (0171-272-6048). The lady who answered me confirmed that they knew of the affair, and had received numerous reports and enquiries. And if my memory is right, it was she who mentioned Enfield and Barnet (two areas to the N.W. of London) as being mainly affected.

This lady also gave me the special telephone number of the Royal Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals, the R.S.P.C.A., for receiving calls about this outbreak. I telephoned to the number in question (01403-264-181), and was informed by the RSPCA lady who answered me that they too were well aware of the affair and were receiving numerous calls.

Some time later the London doctor also contacted the RSPCA lady on the same number, and he too received confirmation that there was indeed such an epidemic of "vandalism" around London.

At first he found her unwilling, it seemed, to be very communicative. However, when he mentioned that he was a G.P. (British medical doctor) she seemed to open up slightly, and went on to tell that, as well as cats, *domestically owned rabbits were* 

also involved.

When he asked what she thought might be committing these depredations, she said that "assuredly no animal could be involved", and that consequently it was clearly the work of people.

The doctor enquired, no doubt facetiously, whether the victims included any humans yet, but as far as I can ascertain he received no answer!

I thought that FSR readers would like to see this report as it may possibly contain features with which they think they are already familiar.

Note that, in the following item from the Daily Telegraph, Dec. 13 1998, mention of blood drainage is carefully avoided. Likewise there is no reference to dead pet rabbits in hutches or cages! G.C.

#### Ritualistic killers stalk family pets.

An organised gang is behind the mutilation of more than 100 pets in the south-east of England, police believe.

Detectives and RSPCA officers are worried by the ritualistic nature of the attacks, in which animals -mainly cats- have had their heads, tails and hind legs removed with a cleaver.

Parallels are being drawn with horse mutilations, carried out across southern England during the past 8 years, which have been linked to satanic cults.

The killings, which started in London, have spread outside the capital. They increased during September and October, and 20 pets were killed last month. Some owners have had post mortem examinations carried out, confirming human involvement.

The attacks began in February when the body of a rabbit and the head of a cat were found at a school in Tottenham, north London.

Officers investigating the killings say it is the first time they have witnessed ritual mutilation on such a large and organised scale. One said: "The number of cases has become so large, that we now believe this is organised killing. It points to some sort of ritualistic

abuse, or black magic. It is very sinister."

The latest victim is a cat belonging to Maggie Jones, 33, a nurse from Tunbridge Wells, Kent. The 10-year old tom cat, Muffin, was found on Monday with its head, back legs, and tail removed.

"If I could get my hands on those responsible, I would feel like doing the same to them. I cannot believe how anybody could do such a thing," she said.

#### INTRODUCTION.

In a letter dated April 17, 1986, one of FSR's oldest and staunchest American readers, Mrs. Giovanna Klopp, of Ventura, California, sent me some extraordinary photostats from the newspaper *Weekly World News* of October 22, 1985, and April 8, 1986. These reports said that Soviet astronauts aboard the space-station *Salyut-7* had had the astounding experience of seeing enormous cosmic beings with wings as large as those of *Jumbo* jets!

Although I already had a lot of material clearly indicating that during and since the 1980s there had been a striking increase in claims of sightings or encounters with angels from all parts of the world - including Russia - I decided to first try to secure evidence of the story from Russia, and in the meantime I just put it on file, for the general opinion everywhere about the Weekly World News and various other American tabloids has always been that they were totally worthless and unreliable. (As most of our readers probably know, those "notorious" American tabloids have for years past carried vast numbers of the most lurid and "way out" sort of UFO reports. So nobody seemingly had a good word to say for them. But it now has turned out that in fact a lot of their "wildest" stories have proved to be true. No wonder then that so much energy went
