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## "SCIENCE"

 $\mathbf{I}^{\scriptscriptstyle \mathrm{T}}$  is astonishing to see how much talk there still is about a "scientific explanation" of the UFO Phenomenon.

The Phenomenon has been a reality for an ever-growing proportion of mankind since it burst upon their consciousness in 1947. (Which of course does not mean to say that it had never existed here previously to 1947. Maybe it has "always been there", but we simply weren't smart enough to know about it!)

So, since 1947, vast numbers of people have been beavering away with their typewriters and, later, with their word-processors and their computers, churning out reams and reams of articles and scores of books. And what has been the upshot of it all? I have yet to learn of any sure evidence that anybody or any Government has gleaned anything whatsoever about the alien vehicles, about their means of propulsion, or about the source or sources from which they and their occupants come. (It is true that we now know — alas — a very great deal about what the entities are doing to us humans. But this unwelcome knowledge does not seem to have brought any compensating benefits to mankind.)

And so I still say: I see no evidence that we have learned anything *scientific*. Perhaps we ought to bear in mind that the Latin word "Scientia" simply means "KNOWLEDGE". AND WHAT WE CALL "SCIENCE" IS OUR KNOWLEDGE.

UNFORTUNATELY FOR US, WE FIND OURSELVES CONFRONTED BY SOMEBODY ELSE'S KNOWLEDGE. And I am left ruminating on the words of Dr J. Allen Hynek who, in the course of an extraordinarily interesting conversation with me which ranged over a whole lot of things far outside the limits of our small and young "Science", had this to say:—

"If, of course, the 'floor' of their science is higher than the 'ceiling' of our science, then there may be no possibility of a meeting of minds, and we may get nowhere."

In making such an observation, Allen Hynek was not acting in the least "like a typical American". For one is reminded of the curious fact that the Americans — maybe far more than any other nation — all seem to believe that any problem that exists is bound to be soluble. No doubt this simplistic view of things stems in part from the fact that they are such a relatively new and "young" and therefore "optimistic" people. Members of older communities such as those of Asia would be unlikely to view matters in that way, since they know full well, from their long, long histories, that not all problems — whether problems of Man, or problems of this poor Planet of ours — are necessarily "soluble" by Man. (As we are shortly going to see!)

Had the average American and average European possessed a better grasp of world history and of other cultures (and especially of other *religions*) they might no doubt have developed a far less clouded vision of the "UFO Problem". And the error stems also from the fact that, as soon as the UFO Phenomenon burst upon their consciousness in 1947, it was instantly and automatically accepted by the overwhelming majority of people that, if these UFOs really did exist, then their operators simply *had to be* our own "peers", folk from other planets, and therefore, *ipso facto*, they had to be "other human beings, just like us".

If, as now seems certain, this sort of thinking is a piece of gross folly, and in all probability one that has been deliberately sown in human minds by the alien creatures, then the whole fatuous idea that they are "other human beings who want to meet us" collapses in ruin.

There is in fact not the slightest shred of evidence that any of them are here to "visit with us", or "to meet us". They have doubtless known all about us for ages past, and it may well be that many of them are the true "natives" of this Planet, and were here long before us. And they are here for their own purposes, and for their own benefit, not for ours. They are not "human beings", but creatures of an entirely different order.

If we fail to understand this, and still cling to the daft and ridiculous "E.T." theory of "Visitors or tourists from other planets", our peril will only be the greater.

## **AUSTRALIA: ON THE UFO TRAIL: IV**

During September 1970, I crossed the Nullarbor Plain in Western Australia for the first time. Since then, my visits to the area have been many, stopping off at first one road-house then another. On each and every trip across that interesting desert outback of Australia I have encountered stories of strange lights, of objects and experiences that have occurred to numerous motorists, truck-drivers and bus-drivers, as well as reports from pilots who have flown over the region.

One of the most recent encounters was that of a Pioneer bus-driver and his passengers who were paced for 10 km. Although the object was near ground level and the sky was overcast with no stars visible at that time, the planet Jupiter was the "explanation" put forward by dedicated debunkers. If true, it was the first recorded appearance of Jupiter below the clouds of Earth.
