

in the main building of the Castle if he had experienced anything the previous evening and he confirmed being disturbed by a bright light illuminating his bedroom shortly after retiring.

Both my wife and our son also heard a cow bellowing at Bridzor Farm which is nearby.

There are no street lights or busy roads in the area and we can hear every sound, including any vehicle entering the Castle grounds at night. Nothing at all was heard however during the period of the event.

SECOND EVENT : May 4th 1994, 4.30 a.m. Light travelling South to North approx.

My son (aged 44) and his girl friend were returning after a few days in Ireland, and were about 1/2

mile from the Castle gates driving in a westerly direction along the Nadder Valley. They had just passed the cemetery on their left when they became aware of a bright blue-white object coming from the South crossing the valley in front of them; it was about mid-height (40 °) in the sky and not too distant, difficult to assess not knowing the size of the object.

It was travelling extremely fast, estimated at 1000 mph, and along the same flight path as event No. 1, but in the opposite direction, i.e. S-N. They described the object as slightly smaller than a full moon, but a full oval rather than a sphere; it left no trail and no sound was heard by the witnesses (the car windows were closed). It then disappeared in horizontal flight to the North. D.T., The Hexagon, Wardour Castle, Tisbury, Salisbury, Wiltshire.

BOOK REVIEW

INTELLIGENCE BEHIND THE UNIVERSE!*

For over one hundred years we have had the experimental proofs that in some way we survive the death of our physical bodies. These were repeatable experiments under laboratory conditions where people who once lived on Earth came back and showed that they were still very much alive. These phenomena were witnessed by international, scientific teams under the leadership of eminent professors and doctors of science — Sir William Crookes OM, FRS (United Kingdom); Professor Charles Richet, the 1913 Nobel Laureate for medicine (France); Dr. Baron Von Schrenck-Notzing MD (Germany); and Dr. Glen Hamilton MD (Canada).

Ever since these revolutionary experiments, scientists have been beavering away to find the mathematical equations that will give a rational explanation to account for what appeared to be something that was supernatural.

Pearson shows that other universes co-exist with us, their matter being tuned to different frequencies from one another and from our own, so that all can interpenetrate one another without interference.

MORE UFO REPORTS FROM WESTERN AUSTRALIA

1. (Report from *Western Australia Sunday Times* of January 16, 1994)
UFO BUZZED MY CAR, SAYS WOMAN

A Subiaco mother-of-three says she was buzzed by a glowing UFO shaped like the teat of a baby's bottle as she drove to a Yanchep tourist resort.

The woman, 34, was terrified as the object swooped down to just above tree-level and tailed her car for several kilometres before swinging away.

The woman, who refused to be identified, is still shaken by the 20-minute encounter and was reluctant to speak to the *Sunday Times*.

Her brother, 27, who was in the car, confirmed that the incident took place on December 31, 1993.

Her description of the UFO is similar to the one given by the Knowles family of Marylands after an unexplained event on the Nullarbor Desert in 1988.*

The Subiaco woman said the object came down on the left-hand side of the car when the pair were driving north on Wanneroo Road at 1.00 a.m.

"We stopped to get a better look and it was about 500m. away. It was shining with lights and I saw a metallic gleam. But it did not look like a plane or a helicopter", she said.

"I was terrified, frozen to the wheel. My brother got out of the car, then I shouted to him to get back in and we sped off. He turned around and it was following us about 1 km. behind and above the road. Then it swung off to the left again as we turned onto the Yanchep road and kept pace with us for a while, then disappeared."

She contacted police, air traffic controllers and staff at RAAF (Royal Australian Air Force) Pearce Base,

who were unable to give her an explanation for the sighting.

"I am convinced that we saw a UFO", she said. "It did not behave like a plane or a helicopter and it was an incredible shape".

UFO researcher Brian Richards said he was investigating the case and was struck by its similarity to other reported sightings.

Mr. Richards, of the UFO Data Collection Centre, said the descriptions given by the Subiaco woman and the Knowles family appeared to be close.

MORE TELL OF UFO ENCOUNTERS

More Perth people have come forward with stories of frightening UFO encounters.

Last week, a Subiaco mother of three children told how she was terrified by a mysterious object which buzzed her as she drove to Yanchep.

Now a Kallaroo woman and a couple from South Perth say they too experienced inexplicable encounters.

They say the objects were like the Yanchep UFO — shaped like a baby's bottle teat.

The 47-year-old Kallaroo woman, who would not be named, told how she was followed on the Midlands Road, near Coorow.

She said: "I was petrified — it was similar to the artists' impression in the paper.

"It was pitch dark, about 8.45 p.m., and this glowing object appeared suddenly and filled up my rear vision mirror.

"I was going at about 110 km/h and it seemed it was sitting on my boot. Then it just glided off to my right at the same speed and shot up into the sky".

The woman said the encounter lasted for up to 15 minutes. She later checked with police and Pearce Air Base, but was unable to explain the sighting.

The 39-year-old South Perth man said he and his girl friend watched a bright object after they spotted it twinkling like a star on the Goomalling Road near Toodyay.

The UFO appeared to be moving in short erratic bursts, at times very quickly. He ruled out the possibility of it being a plane or helicopter.

"It was moving too strangely", he said. "We stopped to have a good look and watched it for a few minutes. Then it just took off".
